with situated on the waters of barcos creek adjoining
John Spainhour being two tracts of land the both together
containing two hundred and nine acres be the same more
or less for her to have and to hold for ever —

Thirdly I do bewill and leave to my beloved wife Mary
Elizabeth Kreegar all my personal estate during her widowhood
for her support and to raise my children and giving them
good schooling and when my youngest child comes of
age for all of my personal and real estate to be divided
into four equal parts between my wife and three children
that is to say first my beloved wife Mary Elizabeth Kreegar
and my son Solomon Kreegar my son Timothy Kreegar
and my daughter Levina Kreegar —

Lastly thereby revoke all other or former will & Testaments
and publish and declare this and this alone to be my
last will and Testament and I do nominate and appoint
my beloved friends Jacob Conrad & Solomon executors
of this my last will and Testament given under
my hand this twenty seventh day of July in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventeen
and sealed with my seal

this fifteenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred & nineteen make and publish this my
last Will and Testament in the manner following that is to say

First I will that the expenses of my burial and all
my just and lawful debts be paid out of my estate.

Secondly My beloved wife Margaret being pregnant
I give and bequeath unto the child of her body that tract
or parcel of land which by the partition of our plantation
came to my share containing about Twenty one acres

in a certain undivided tract of land lying in Stokes County

In case my beloved wife should be delivered of more
than one child the children are to possess equal right
to the above mentioned tract of land — And in case
the child or children should die before they are of age
the above described tract of land and also my right to
the said undivided tract shall belong to my beloved
wife — Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my beloved
wife Margaret all and every other of my property
after so much thereof has been sold as will discharge
all my just and lawful debts —

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And I hereby make & ordain my beloved wife ~~along~~
dear brother Henry Nine and my worthy friend John
Butner executors of this my last will and Testament in
witness whereof I the said Peter Nine have set my hand
and seal the day and year above written

I likewise constitute make and ordain my son William
Beck & John Null the sole executors of this my last
will & Testament and I do hereby wholly disannul and
revoke all former Testaments, Wills, Legacies and executors
ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last
will & Testament in witness whereof I subscribe at my hand
and seal this 30th of January in the year of our lord
