

In the name of God amen.

I Philip Green junior of Stokes County of the State of North Carolina being through the abundant mercy and goodness of God, though weak in body but of sound mind and memory, thanks be given to God, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of God my Maker humbly desiring his acceptance of it through the all sufficient merits of my dear Redeemer Jesus Christ. And my body I recommend to the Earth from whence it was taken to be buried in a decent Christian Burial on the burying grounds of the United Brethren at Friedland at the direction of Executors as to my worldly Estate I give and bequeath the same in manner & form following Viz. I give unto Elizabeth my dearly beloved wife during her natural life the House and Land where I now live and one shelf in the house and all there is thereon also one chest and table and one bed also one hoop wash kettle and washing furniture, also one milk cow and one third of my personal Estate to have & hold the same for herself her heirs and assigns as her sole property forever with full and ample liberty to dispose of the same as she pleases.

2^d I give unto Catharine & Anna Green my beloved Daughters one cow apiece also one bed set to each of them and I give unto Anna my daughter one bed and one spinning wheel.

3^d I give the other two thirds of my Estate to my children in the manner following. I give to my son Frederick Green and to Eliza Green my son Jacob's daughter and Christina wife of East Loring and to Hannah wife of Philip Alder and to Elizabeth Green children and to Salome wife of Daniel Hartman and the two thirds to be equally divided between the above son & daughters.

4th I give unto my eldest son John Philip Green all the land on the south side of Twicken Fork till on the meadow ground the line to begin on the corner of my meadow and to run a straight line to a certain rock near the spring house thence four yards from the bottom to the line and the said land to be valued at \$6 per acre and for my son Philip Green to have an equal share with the rest of my children and for him to have said land for his sole property and it is my will and desire that my son Frederick Green pay out of his share of the Estate the sum of ten dollars for a good horse that I sold him.

5th My tract of land containing about one hundred & sixty five acres and the improvements thereon shall not be sold during the natural life of my dear wife Elizabeth.

N.B. There is on the tract of land one acre with a school house thereon appropriated for the use of the settlement they pay the sum of four dollars in the term of three years or else to be null and void and also eight Regs that is now in the power of my servant to let them go towards my family year provision & I do hereby make constitute and appoint my beloved Brother Conrad Green and my wife Elizabeth Executors of this my last will and Testament who are to pay my last debts and settle all my accounts and they shall have to fix the time for the sale of my personal Estate — and whereas there is two brown boys living with me Moses & Amos Steward my design is for my Executors to do with them as they think proper.

In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal this fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.
