mother's decease.

I do hereby empower my executor to sell my
horse unto my brother Peter Hine at private sale
for sixty Dollars, if he cannot get that he is to
sell him at public sale for the most that can be
got for him.

I do appoint my friend John Butner as my
executor to this my last will and testament and
do hereby revoke all others and do declare this to
be my last will and testament.

Jr. of Wake County State of North Carolina being sick and
Weak in body but of sound mind Memory do make and publish
declare this to be my last Will and Testament that is to say.

First I give and bequeath unto Barbara wife of John Little
Mary wife of John David, Sally wife of Jacob Pinkley, Mary
wife of Anthony Dinkler Elizabeth wife of Adam Putner &
Henry Fry in equal portions a certain Covenant or Obligation
which I have on John Fry for Six Hundred Dollars due at
certain times by Installments of fifty Dollars each. It is
my will that the said hundred given to Elizabeth wife of
Adam Putner shall be equally divided amongst all
the Children which she now has & may hereafter have
& the part given to Mary wife of John David to be equally
divided amongst all the Children which she now has &
may hereafter have.

Second It is my will that my negro Slaves shall be
retained by said white men chosen for that purpose and
remain in possession of my wife during her natural
life if she should choose to keep them a part of
them as she chooses and at her death in any of
my Children should choose to take said negroes at
the valuation they may do so they to the other Children
a proportionable part of said valuation otherwise to be
sold.

Third. I give and bequeath unto my wife during
her natural life one horse creature four Cows
all the Sheep, three Poultry, one set of Sows and
such of the Household furniture as she may choose
to keep for her use.

Fourth It is my will that all my other Estate
not otherwise disposed of shall be sold by my
Executors and the monies arising therefrom together
