executor to this my last will and testament and
do hereby revoke all others and do declare this to
be my last will and testament.

Jew. of Stokes County State of North Carolina being sick and
weak in body but of sound mind & memory do make and publish
declare this to be my last Will and Testament that is to say

First I give and bequeath unto Barbara wife of John Lard
my wife of John Lard, Sally wife of Jacob Shubley, Lucy
wife of Anthony Shubley Elizabeth wife of Adam Butler &
Henry Big in equal portions a certain covenant or obligation
which I have on John Big for one hundred dollars due at
certain times by installments of fifty dollars each. It is
my will that the part which goes to Elizabeth wife of
Adam Butler shall be equally divided amongst all
the children which she now has & may hereafter have
& the part given to Sally wife of John Lard to be equally
divided amongst all the children which she now has &
may hereafter have

Second It is my will that my negro slaves shall be
retained by interested men chosen for that purpose and
remain in possession of my wife during her natural
life if she should choose to keep them a set of
them as she chooses and at her death in any of
my children should choose to take said negroes at
the valuation they may do so pay to the other children
a proportionable part of said valuation whenever it
is sold

Third I give and bequeath unto my wife during
her natural life one horse creature four hours
all the Sheep, three Peckhins, one set of Geese and
such of the Household furniture as she may choose
to keep for her use.

Fourth It is my will that all my other Estate
not otherwise disposed of shall be sold by my
executors and the money arising therefrom to be
