of Stokes County and State of North Carolina, being with
common health, sound mind, memory and understanding,
praised be God for it, and considering the certainty of death
and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and to the end it may
be better prepared to leave this world, so however it shall please
God to call me hence, do therefore make and declare this my
last will and Testament in manner following, that is to say first
and principally I commend my soul into the hands of
Almighty God my creator, hoping for your pardon and
remission of all my sins through the merits Jesus Christ
my saviour, my body I commit to the earth at the discretion
of my executors, herein after named. I wish that all my
just debts as shall be by me owing at my death together
with my funeral expenses, and all charges touching the
proving of or otherwise concerning this my will, shall in
the first place out of my personal estate and effects be
fully paid and satisfied, and soon and after payment
thereof and subject thereto then my will is, that all the
residue of my goods, stock, chattels, merchandises and
house hold furniture together with all my lands ten-
ements and negroes and all other property whatsoever belong-
ing to my loving wife, and I do hereby give & bequeath the same
unto my wife Elizabeth for and during the term of her
natural life, and at her death, my will is, that the
lawful heir of my son John Zimmerman Deceased shall
receive the sum of One Dollar and no more to be paid
by my executors out of my estate, and the residue of
my goods, stock, chattels, merchandises & house hold
furniture, together with my lands, tenements & negroes
shall be disposed of in the following manner. (To wit)
My negroes shall be impartially appraised, and after
such appraisement made, the same shall be divided equally
between my five children Thomas Reuben Anderson
Susan and Elizabeth, said negroes to be equally parted & divided
among them share and share alike for the term of their
natural lives, and at death, said negroes with all their increase
of body to belong to their heirs forever.
All the residue of my property, goods, stock, chattels mer-
chandises and house hold furniture together with my lands,
shall be exposed to public sale to the highest bidder as by
law directed in cases of administration and after the collection
of the money due or produced by the above named sale of sd

property at the time required by law for collection in the case above cited. the proceeds thereof shall be equally divided among my said five children share and share alike, and to be paid and delivered unto my said children as soon as collected as above directed. And my will and meaning is in case any of my above named children depart this life before such time as the part or portion of him or her or them aforesaid shall become payable then and in case the part or portion of him or them so dying shall go and be equally divided among the survivors or survivor of them share and share alike, if more than one and to be paid to such survivors or survivor at the time aforesaid. And of do hereby make and ordain my son Reuben Zimmerman, executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I Reuben Zimmerman at the testator here to this my will consisting of two sheets of paper. Set my hand and seal this the thirtieth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five.

Item third I will to my son Joseph in addition to the above one shot gun one flat Iron I further will all the cloth on hand to Joseph & the Bible & all his school books I further will all the remainder of my property to my son & Daughter to be equally divided between as they think best they may each choose persons if they cannot agree to act for them in the division or make sale of the property & divide the money each of them to pay equal of the funeral expenses I do ordain the above to be my last will & testament this the twenty first day of March 1843.
