I Joshua Cox, Jr. of the County of Stokes & State of North Carolina taking into consideration the certainty of death & the uncertainty of life do make ordain & publish this as my last will & testament, in manner & form following, that is to say.

First. It is my will & desire that Letitia Watson have one hundred acres of land to be taken off of the lower end of my tract to run from east side to west side of said tract & that she hold the same in fee simple.

Secondly. I will a bequeath all of my stock of cattle, hogs & one cow to James Watson.

Thirdly. It is my will & desire that my sister Nancy have twenty dollars out of my estate.

Fourthly. It is my will & desire that the balance of my land be equally divided between my sister now living & the heirs of those who have died.

It is my desire that Richard Cox be constituted & appointed the executor of this my last will & testament.

In testimony whereof I do hereunto set my hand & seal this the 23^d day of May 1836.

The third day of August 1836 Richard Hill of Stokes County &
State of North Carolina being sick, but of sound mind & memory did
this day call upon us Samuel Hill, Jr. & John Norton to witness his will
within the limits of law, after my death this 15th day of August 1836 it
being the third day after his death in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred & thirty six, we certify this to be his will to us prescribed
agreeable to his request on the day just above mentioned.

Item 1^o. - It is my will that all my just debts be paid out of my estate
in the following manner viz: that my negroes be hired out & my Southern
plantation be rented until my debts are paid with such perishable
property as can conveniently be spared.

Item 2^o. - It is my will that my wife Nancy have the use of all
the rest of my estate during her widowhood & prudent behaviour
for her support & children, until my youngest child becomes of age,
and then to be equally divided amongst all my children, with the
exception of one negro girl named Mary or Caroline, which said negro
to remain in her possession during her natural life & then said
negro & increase also to be equally divided among all my
children. Given under our hands & seals this 15th day of August
A.D. 1836.
