First of all I will that all my just debts be paid out of my
personal Estate by my executors hereafter named,
Secondly I do give unto my dear wife Lavinia Barnard
her choice in my brown & bay horse with her saddle &
bridle & the feather bed & furniture on which we lodge
for common and one half of the linen in my house
that has been made since we were married I mean
linen & Cotton such as sheets & towels and all her wearing
clothes & one black & silver

testament of Tristram Barnard dec'd of which the foregoing

In the name of God Amen! I Robert Sharp Hamilton of
the County of Stokes and State of North Carolina being sick & weak
in body but of perfect sound mind reason & memory And calling
to mind the frailty of my mortal body and especially that it is
appointed for all men one to die Do make and ordain this
to be my last will & testament in manner & form as follows
That is to say First I give & bequeath unto my well beloved wife
one negro man named Abraham one negro woman
named Jude one negro boy named Isaac one negro
girl named Ester one negro boy named William, one
negro boy named Abraham one negro girl named Hannah
& one negro man named Peter together with two hundred
acres of land to be laid off from my own thousand acres
tract which lies on Elk river in the State of Tennessee together
with all my movable property of Horses Cattle Hogs furniture
stone goods books debts cash &c &c during the term of her
natural life & widowhood & whensoever it shall please
God to remove her by death or upon her marriage with
another man, all the said property (after paying all my lawful
debts) shall descend to my two sons John Hamilton & Isaac
Hamilton when they come of lawful age and their
heirs forever. (except the negro woman Jude who shall
be Born free the property of my said wife Mary during
her lifetime whether she marries again or not after my
decease & the two Hundred acres of land.

76 I give and bequeath to my two sons John & James Hamilton eight hundred acres of land being the balance of my thousand acre tract lying on Elk River in the State of Tennessee to be equally divided between them, there is 150 acres of land lying on the Rocky branch in Guilford County and 100 acres lying on Snow Creek Stokes County which I order to be sold toward the payment of my debts &c. And I do hereby order ordain, nominate & appoint General John Hamilton, my beloved uncle, and Andrew Robinson require my faithful friends together with my beloved wife Polly Hamilton executors of this my last will & testament Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament

In Witness whereof I set my hand this 10th day of March A.D. 1807.

I John Heat Senior of Stokes County North Carolina being sick in body though in perfect sense & memory, knowing it was once appointed for all men to die, I yield my soul to God who gave it me hoping that through the merits of his dear son Jesus Christ to rise again at the last day in immortal glory blessed be God and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors... And what worldly estate it hath pleased God to lend me I give & bequeath in manner & form following to wit.

Item. I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Catharine Heat all my lands & tenements goods & chattels and stock of every kind including all debts moneys &c. to her during her natural life or widowhood. And at her death or marriage I desire that all my estate both real & personal &c. should be equally divided amongst my children but if any of my children should die before they come of lawful age or marriage then the above mentioned estate to be equally divided amongst those surviving

Item. I give to my daughter in law Polly Heat Ten Shillings Currency to be paid by my executors out of my estate.

Item. I give to my grand daughter Polly Heat when she arrives of lawful age ten pounds Hard money to be raised out of my estate.

Lastly I appoint my wife, Peter Pinkley & John Heat joint my executors & administrators And if my son Abraham Heat should remove back here to live I desire he may act in place of Peter Pinkley
