 Second I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary
 Ann Tague my mill and land with all the profits
 belonging of every kind in during her widowhood and
 if she should marry my will is that she should
 have only a Child part I also give her all the household
 furniture my beds and every thing belong to them with
 every other needful thing about the house a plantation
 also all my Cows and Hogs and if my son Jacob Tague
 or my daughter Pety should marry and leave their
 mother that their mother if she can possibly spare
 it to give each of them as much as I gave my other
 when they left me The notes of Michael & George
 Henry is not to become payable till after the death
 of their mother and at her death every thing is
 to be equally divided among my Children, to wit

Henry George Elizabeth Michael Jacob & Pety. 1777

 1816. I Salome Kessel of Stokes County and State of North Carolina
 being very weak in body but perfect mind and memory
 Thanks be given unto God therefor. Calling to mind the mortality
 of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all persons
 to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
 that is to say Principally First of all I give and recommend
 my soul into the hands of the almighty God that gain it
 and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian
 burial at the discretion of my executor nothing doubting
 but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
 again by the mighty power of God and as touching
 such worldly estate whomeof with it pleased God
 to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose
 of the same in the following manner

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Elizabeth Grun wife of Philip Grun one half of my wearing apparel the other half to my three grand daughters of my daughter Molly namely Katy Runk wife of John Rank Salome Nipson wife of Christian Nipson & Elizabeth Reed wife of Charles Reed to have and to hold forever to be divided by the Executor or some person appointed by him.

Second I give and bequeath that all my property to me belonging now or money shall be divided in four equal parts to the following persons namely Jacob Adgenum Sen. one John George Logenour & one John Elizabeth Grun wife of Philip Grun one share and my grand children of my daughter Molly namely John Fogler George Fogler Cat Runk wife of John Rank Salome Nipson wife of Christian Nipson & Elizabeth Reed wife of Charles Reed one share to hold forever.

3^d I will and bequeath that the executor take an inventory of all my property after my decease as soon as possible and collect my debts to me owing either in notes or bonds or any other debts of what sort named they be or assign the notes to the legatus they all just debts I owe give receipts and take the same and make equal dividend amongst the legatus. ~~of my property~~ and also appoint a day of sale amongst the legatus of my property to the highest bidder and give the property in his possession or care of the executor.

Fourth. I leave some of my outstanding debts shall be lost shall be cancelled.

four legatus also that Joseph Henson shall have ¹⁷⁸⁴ or interest on money he owes to me as I will and bequeath it unto him to have & hold forever.

Fifthly. I hereby will and ordain my friend Joseph Henson my executor of this my last will and testament I in case he should fail to act as such then John Fogler of Salem to be my executor of this my last will and testament in which whom I the said Salome Kinnell have to this my last will and testament let my hand be the day and year above written.
