The Verbal Will of Samuel Hampton late of
Stokes County & State of North Carolina Dec. taken
down in writing within nine days after his
Death witnessed

That his widow & Infant Bethenia Hampton
should keep the plantation the negroes & the whole of
his property in her possession that his children

should be raised & educated, that his children as they
grow up & stand in need should have one of the young
negroes a piece, that his widow & children when
a Division takes place should all have an equal
share, that two horses now remaining on the
plantation on known by the name of Peubram
& one he purchased of William Reynolds be sold
immediately at public sale that eight or ten head
of cattle should be sold if in need, that John Boston
negro (and William Blackburn join with his widow
Bethenia in the administration) see that this his
last will & testament be duly executed taken down
in the presence of the subscribing witnesses who
heard him pronounce the above he then being in
his perfect senses.
