

47) <sup>(48)</sup> I Solomon Hauser of the County of Stokes and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in the manner and form following that is to say I direct that my executors herein after named shall provide for my body a decent Christian burial, and pay, etc funeral expenses together with all my just debts, however and to whom ever owing, out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my Estate.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth all my real estate, and all that may, be thereon grown or growing which includes the half of the land and mill generally known by the name of Saddles mill.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to her all my personal property, that may remain after all my just debts are paid

Fourthly I give and bequeath to her a negro boy Chuck - all the above mentioned my wife is to have and use for her benefit as long as she may live, and after his death, all that may remain is to be sold at public sale on such credit as my be considered most advantageous by the executor and the proceeds divided equal among the children of my brother and Sister that is to say and all is to be sold at such time

Fifthly my executor is to sell so much of my personal property as will pay all my just debts at publick sale on such time as he may think best. I do hereby appoint my friend George H. Wilson to be my executor signed sealed published and delivered by the said Solomon Hauser to be his last will and testament in presence of us each other do subscribe our names as witness thereto

Item I leave to my well beloved wife Lucretia Vance the Plantation I now live on that I have called to my son Mr. Vance at her death also all of my stock of horses Cattle Hogs and all of my house hold & Kitchen furniture during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between my Son & Daughter or their heirs. Lastly I appoint my son John Vance my Executor of this my last will & testament witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty second day of May One thousand Eight hundred and thirty eight
