appointed unto all men once to die I do make
and ordain this my last will & testament in
manner & form following Viz.

It is my will that all my just debts be
paid out of my personal estate I do give unto
my son John two hundred & fifty acres of
land of the lower end of the tract whereon
I now live joining Samuel Pitts to him & his
heirs forever

I do give unto my son Joseph the remain-
der of my land lying between that I have
given my son John & that he purchased of his
brother Jordan to him & his heirs forever

I do give unto my daughter Elizabeth
two feather beds that she claims as hers
with the furniture thereto belonging also one
cow & a pig also the privilege to shed room
at and out my house during the time she
remains in a unmarried state

I do give all the residue of my estate
to my Children namely Simmons, Jordan,
Joseph, John, Semina, Sarah, Ann &
Elizabeth Also it is my will that Jenny
Pearson Children namely Joseph, William,
Elizabeth, Jan Semina, Sarah have the
ninth part and that to be equally divided
between them & my above named Children
to have the rest equally divided between
them & lastly I do appoint my son Simmons
& ~~Joseph~~ Pearson Executors of this my last
will & testament made this twenty th

day of the month month 1809.

and the remaining part of my property I will to be sold
and equally divided between my wife Jane Fountain and my

James Fountain and Sally Fountain.

I do constitute my truly friends Joseph Waggoner
and James Fountain to be my executors I hereby revoke
and disannul all other wills and constitutions this and
no other to be my last will & Testament In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this the 23^d day of February A.D. 1800.

mind & memory (blessed be God) do this 31st day of December
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifteen
make and publish this my last will & Testament in the

beloved wife four Negroes namely Saller and Lett Aaron
& Jacob her captives and after her death to be equally divided
between my eight children and all my other tracts of land
beside the above mentioned land is to be equally divided
between my seven daughters after my decease also I give
and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Sally one Negro boy
by name of Lewis & to my next eldest daughter Polly one Negro
girl by the name of Amy and to my daughter Cety one
Negro girl ~~Agnes~~ by the name of Rebecca and to my
daughter Agnes one Negro girl by the name of Mimy
Also I give to my daughter Nancy one Negro boy by the name
of Sampson and to my daughter Debby one Negro boy
by the name of Martin and to my daughter Cynthia one
Negro girl by the name of Jane which Negroes is to be
divided at my decease also I give & bequeath to my
son Joshua one Negro man by the name of Bob
