To me and whences my said children Horina, Rebecca, Eugenio, Samuel & Anna Rosina are minors under the age of twenty one years, now that on my will and desire is that my brother Samuel Trump is lawfully constituted and appointed Guardian of these my three children to have & to hold the custody & guardianship both of them respective Persons & Estates until they shall severally attain at the full age of twenty one years, and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my said Brother Samuel Trump my lawful Executor to all intents & purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent & meaning thereof hereby revoking & declaring void all other wills & testaments by me before made in witness whereof I the said Ephraim Trump have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of July A.D. 1845

that I William Boyer, in the name of God Amur being of  
sound mind and memory blessed be God - but in a low  
state of health at present do ordain and constitute this my  
last will and Testament in the words following to wit  
1st I will and bequeath to my beloved son Hector the  
trust of land containing Sixty three acres which I Recd  
from my Father's estate by his paying to his sisters the  
sum of one hundred dollars when his youngest sister

203 Come of age. The balance of my land I will and  
bequeath to my son Decatur if he thinks proper to take  
it when he comes of age by his paying the sum of Three  
dollars per acre for it & to be so if he does not choose to take  
the land at that price it is to be equally divided between them  
all. I further will and bequeath that my plantation be sold  
to the highest bidder until my son Decatur is Eighteen years  
old and if he is a good boy and my Executors think proper  
they may give him possession of it at that age. I further will  
and bequeath that my Negroes all be hired out until my  
daughter Lavinia is of age. I desire my Executors to hire  
my Negroes to persons that will use them well, and I  
give my Executors liberty to hire them out privately if they  
think proper. When Lavinia comes of age they may be  
equally divided if it is Decatur & Lavinia's wish according  
to valuation and when they are divided the three youngest  
children's shares to be hired out either privately or publicly  
till until my youngest daughter come of age. I further  
will and bequeath that all the balance of my property  
be sold to the highest bidder. My Whiskey & Wine & Hides  
to be sold on a credit of four months so that my debts may  
be discharged so soon, the balance of my property to  
be sold on a credit of twelve months and my corn to  
be sold when my executors think it will be best and  
after paying all my just debts to be equally divided between my  
beloved children Decatur, Lavinia, Catharine, Abby & my youngest  
daughter which I have for Brother in law John Harper & my  
sister Catharine to name, a note I have on former desire to be  
collected & paid out towards paying my debts I desire my executors  
to get good places for my children to live at & to send to them schooling  
& every thing else as they my think best. I further will & desire that  
my beloved Brother John Boyer & my beloved brother in law John  
Harper be appointed executors to this my last will & testament.

304 Knowing the certainty of death Solomon  
Conrad of the County of Stokes and State of North  
Carolina, on this the twenty fourth day of September in the  
Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty  
five, do make & ordain this my last will & Testament  
in the way and manner following. In my will I give to  
my beloved companion Mary Conrad, all my wheat  
corn grown on the plantation, the good stack of hay,  
one cow my choice, two birds and furniture, the bureau  
and books case, all the cooking utensils, all cutting &  
crocking, two Stoops her choice & two, munto fatter, her  
choice, one table, Four chairs, one water bucket, one  
cupboard, one large spinning wheel and one little spinning  
wheel, one Reel, one pair of cards, And I further will  
that my plantation wherow I now live shall be sold as  
soon after my death as my executors shall think proper  
at public sale on a credit of twelve months and that  
the Interest arising from the sale of said land should  
be paid annually to my wife. — I also will & give  
to my wife one crop of flax, as much of the potatoe  
of both kinds as she may choose, and all the cabbage, all  
the turnips, Thirty pounds of coffee, all the honey on  
hand, One stook of Bees, two bushels of salt, all  
all the sole leather & upper leather enough to make all  
one pair of shoes apiece, to be bought if not enough on  
hand all the wool on hand.

It is my will that as soon after my death as may  
be convenient convenient and proper that all my  
property not before willed should be sold on a  
credit of twelve months and that out of the proceeds  
all my just debts be paid and the residue be or  
the Interest thereon should be paid over annually  
to my wife, the same as for the lands and that she  
hold the property willed to her and receive the interest  
as auncie so long as she remains my widow or  
otherwise during life.

I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Solomon  
Poff and my Brother John Conrad as my executors  
done at my request and signed with my hand  
the day & year first above written. In the  
presence of the witnesses who were called up to witness  
the same, & were in the presence of each other
