relatives and pay all funeral charges to gather with all  
my just debts now sovra and to whomsoeuer may come out of  
the money that may first come into his hands as a part of my  
estate. Second I give and Devise to my beloved children  
by Hannah Williard Elisabeth Rosenthaler Dinah  
Whose heirs her share devitt between them Richard Clampet  
Sarah Mier William Clampet Ruth Harrel and Alice Harrel  
to each of them one Dollar which together with the other advancements  
made by me to them at divers other times will make  
them a fair and equal portion according to the value of my  
property and estate to be theirs and their Disposal absolutely forever.  
Thirdly I give and Devise to my Daughter Mary Clampet one  
Cow and one yearling heifer & choice out of my flock also three sheep  
her Choice one feather bed bedding and furniture one Chest  
one Big wheel one pot one Oven six plates one looking glass one  
pair of Cards her choice which articles will make about equal  
portion with the rest of my Children out of my estate to be

hers and at her Disposal forever Fourthly I give and Devise  
to my beloved wife Ruth all the remainder of my property  
of every kind to be hers so long as she lives and after her Death  
to belong to my son George Clampet and his heirs forever  
provided he attends to and maintains his mother from my Death  
until her Death. Fifthly and lastly I do hereby constitute and  
appoint my trusty friend George Clampet my lawful Executor  
to all intents and purposes to Execute this my last will and  
testament according to the true intent and meaning of the  
same and every part thereof hereby making and declaring  
utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore  
made in witness whereof I the said William Clampet do here  
unto set my hand and seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1839.
