

Whereas I Thomas Ballard of the County of Stokes State of North Carolina being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make and ordain this my last will & testament that is to say

As touching the worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise & bequeath of the same in the following manner First My deare & well is that all my just debts be legally discharged

Second That the tract of land wheroun I now live containing one hundred & forty two acres belong to my son Thomas with all buildings houses or barns and all other appurtenances provided nevertheless that my beloved wife Elizabeth shall have from time to time proportion of the hours plantation wheroun they now stand during her life a widowhood together with all plantation Illinois thence that furnitures at her decease or marriage my son Thomas to become proprietor of said land and all plantation there is with all the stock horses sheep cattle and hogs and further that my wife to have all house hold furnitures together with certain young horses four and young red Brindle Horses as her own private property until in her other affairs written Mortation.

Lastly that reposing special confidance in my beloved wife Elizabeth & son Byram Ballard

I do constitute and appoint them my sole executors to execute this my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 18th day of the twelfth month one thousand eight hundred others.

5. I give Bequeath to my beloved son John Howell one  
some filly foal Mr Howell in the Spring 1803  
to him this his for ever
6. I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Polly Anna  
Thirty five Dollars money of the United States on a Cott to  
the valuation of that money and the Cott not to exceed  
seven months old to her this his for ever
7. My due debts to be paid & funeral Charges and the  
remaining part of my Estate I leave to my beloved  
wife during her natural life and after her death  
to be equally divided between Rebekah John & Polly  
Howell.
8. I do constitute & appoint My beloved wife  
Sarah and my son in law John Thomason Executor  
of this my last will & testament
