August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred & three make & publish this my last will
& testament in manner following that is to say
first I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Elizabeth all my personal property with lands
and all that appertains thereto during her natural
life After her decease my estate shall be divided
amongst my children in form following that is to say
I give and bequeath unto my eldest son Johnson three
slaves named Frank Hannah young & Roger also I give
and bequeath unto my son W^m Rutledge eight Shillings also
I give and bequeath to my son Peter Rutledge one Negro
boy named Lewis also I give and bequeath to the first
husband of my son Benjamin Rutledge one negro named
Charles also I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin
Rutledge Eight Shillings also I give and bequeath to my
daughter Sarah Three pounds hard money to be paid
her by my sons Ben^m & Elijah in this manner Benjamin
must pay five pounds out of his share part of Elijah
Fifteen pounds to be paid her in payment of five
pounds each annually also I give and bequeath to
my daughter Mary two slaves named Ann
& Hannah (whom she has got) also I give and
bequeath to my son Elijah Rutledge five slaves

named Sam Holly Anthony Hannah & Ben
also Hannah increase from the above date
likewise my land houses and household furniture
Stock and every thing belonging to the plantation
whereon I now live And I hereby Ordain
my son Elysh Executor of this my last will
& Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand seal the Day & year above
written.

of Stokes County and State of North Carolina being
in health of body and mind thanks be given
unto God Calling unto mind the mortality of my
body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die do make and ordain this my last will
& testament. As touching such mortaly estate wherewith
it has pleased god to bless me with in this life I give
and dispose of the same in the following manner &
form. First that my wife beloved wife Mary have
one third of my moveable estate by her freely to
be enjoyed during her widow hood & also give to my
eldest son Joseph the sum of Ten pounds & my second son
Cleatow the sum of Ten pounds and my third son John
the sum of Twenty pounds my youngest son Doughty
one hundred acres of land to be taken of from the
south end of my Drivley plantation so as for it to
take in what is called the old orchard & Spring &c.
Now I have three Daughters living which I have
given their portions unto but to keep them in renum-
brance of me I give to each of them Five Dollars
a piece their names is Mary Sundy and Content
Wortman & Elizabeth Sundy also it is my will
that my Grand Daughter Mary Sundy should have
a feather bed and one cow and it is also my
will that my plantation should be sold and mortgaged
and all my Just Debts paid and after the wife
has rec'd her third the remaining two thirds
