In the name of God Amen I William Seague Seant of the County of Stokes and State of North Carolina. Knowing the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life but being of sound mind and memory and my intellectual faculties are impaired so far the better settling of my outward estate after my decease make and ordain this my last will and testament revoking all others heretofore made by me. In the words following viz,

First I will that all my just debts shall be punctually paid by my executors after my decease. Secondly, I give my beloved wife Elizabeth Seague one hundred acres of land including the improvements on the east end of my tract of land on which I now live during her natural life and after her decease the said land is to be my youngest son Elijah Seague and my wife in that my said son Elijah Seague shall have all the balance of my said tract of land on which I now live. Thirdly I further will and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Seague the following articles. One Horse call'd Fly two Cows and Calves and one small black and white dog and all the stock of Hogs and Sheep one plow One Harrow One Ax. one Hoe one Mallet one pair of geers one Bureau one Walnut dresser and Furniture six Wender Chairs

and four other chairs one Walnut Chest three Boxes and Bedsteads and furniture Clock looking Glass Walnut Table Kitchen dresser and furniture and all the other Kitchen furniture Room table Bridle and all the wash tubs and all the Spoons, Spatulas and Books and as much of the what ever else may be found in the house Bacon salt as will support her and her family and Stock and Cough Conquer Dreine and Stock till the first day of November in the year eighteen hundred and thirty nine to will or disposed of as the pleasure fourthly I give to my beloved wife Fifty dollars to be done with next year.

Fifthly my will is that all my Crop Tools be equally divided & likewise my three Sons William, Isaac and Elijah to give faithfully my will & that after my decease my personal Estate not heretofore mentioned be sold on a credit of twelve months and the money arising from the sale thereof with what money may be on hand and all my outstanding debts by bond or otherwise after satisfying the above bequests and my legal claims be equally divided between my wife and my daughter and two other sons, viz. Elizabeth Seague, Phoebe Robins, Anna drawn Martha Pitts, Anna, William Sarah Stuckey Elizabeth biggots William Seague Isaac Seague except Anna McCollum and Sarah Stuckey and William Seague and Isaac Seague is not to have as much as the rest by Thirty Dollars each I do hereby constitute and appoint my Eldest son William Seague and youngest son Elijah Seague Executors of this my last will and testament with full power and authority to carry the same into effect Signed with my hand and sealed with my seal this Twenty fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight
