I William Stokes of the County of Stokes
& State of North Carolina being sick &
languishing in body, of sound mind & memory
and calling to mind the Mortality of my body
& knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die do make ordain & appoint this my last
will & testament that is to say first of all
I resign my soul to my Creator who gave it to me
& my body to the earth to be buried at the
direction of my Executors - And as to worldly
goods wherewith it has pleased God to bless me
both real & personal Estate I will that it shall
be disposed off in the following manner
first I will that the Personal part of my
Estate shall be equally divided between
amongst my beloved Wife Martha and
my dear children and also that that my
landed Estate shall be equally divided
amongst my children and that my beloved
wife shall have her share of lands at and
including the dwelling place where I now
live -

I also earnestly desire with I request that

the Court of the aforesaid County shall appoint Commissioners to value appraise and divide my Estate real and personal between & amongst my beloved wife & children & that each child shall when they become of lawful age receive & inherit their equal part & that the said Commissioners shall designate & allot to each respectively their equal part.

I also Will and appoint my beloved wife Executrix & Joseph Flood & Thomas Fardwell Executors of this my last Will & Testament I also Will that my Estate shall remain in Possession of my wife during her widowhood for the purpose of raising my children & that the residue of part which is not given up to them as they arrive at lawful age to receive their equal part as aforesaid.

And I do by these presents revoke & annul & make void all other will or wills by me heretofore made.

The last Will & Testament of William Webb Decd of which the foregoing is a true Copy was proven in open Court by the oath of Charles Beatty one of the Subscribing Witnesses thereto who says that said Webb appeared to be of sound disposing mind & memory & that he said Webb read unto him that he said he was satisfied and that said Webb was asked a second time if he was satisfied & answered that once was enough for him to say he was. He then said he could not write his name but requested Capt. Flood to write it for him which said Flood did write & when said Webb acknowledged it to be his hand & seal. By the oath of Joseph Flood who swears that said Webb applied to him to write his will which he said Flood did write according as he directed him and after it was written said Webb acknowledged it to be his will & requested said Flood to write his name to it as he could not write it himself which being done he acknowledged it to be his hand & seal & was named to be recorded which is accordingly done.
