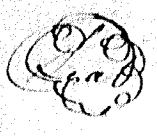

in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty
seven. I David Linville of Surry County, North Carolina State
being very sick & weak in body, but of perfect mind & memory,
thanks be given unto God for the same; And calling to mind
the mortality of my body, knowing that it is appointed for all
men to die. Do make & ordain this my last Will & testament
that is to say, principally I first of all I give & recommend

Surry County and State of North Carolina, being of sound
mind and disposing memory calling to mind my mortality; that
it is appointed for man to die, do make this my last Will and
Testament in manner and form following, to wit: —
I resign my Soul to God who gave it thro' the
merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour, and my body to the dead
to be buried in a decent manner, at the discretion of my
Executors herein after named, and what it hath pleased
God to lend me of this worldly goods I dispose of as follows.
Item. I will that all my debts and funeral charges be paid,

on which I now live. Item. I give unto my son Jesse Hill an
improvement or claim of land adjoining the above mentioned plantation.
Item. I give unto my three youngest sons James Hill Joshua &
Isaac Hill the sum of £100 each to be paid in schooling them
