Surry, do this twenty first day of February 1787. Do ordain
and make this my last will & testament. First I leave to my
wife Conney Melton the part of the land that I now live on
called the lower end; divided in the following manner
beginning at the mouth of a little branch that runs

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through my field between me and my son John at a Walnut
Stump on the west side of the D branch, thence Northwest
to a apple tree blazed on both sides near the top of the hill
where my old house once stood; thence a straight course to the
back line. I also lend to my wife induring her widowhood,
one feather bed and furniture and all my household furniture
of every kind; also all my plantation tools of every kind, also
my Hare and all my Horses & Naggs, small and great, that
I now possess; and my son David to have maintenance off the
same, and at my wifes death every thing that I now have
or lend to her, I give to my son David to him and his heirs
forever. I also give to my son John Molton the upper
end of my land, to be divided in the following manner.

Beginning on the west side and at the mouth of a little

Do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament.
