Dish and two plates, I Enjoin I give to my Cousin Jeremiah Shilton one
Cow and Cattle, I do conclude and Appoint my beloved wife Mary
Shilton and John Appleton my sole Executors of this my Last will
and Testament, I do hereby Declare and make void all wills
Legacies &c. and Executors made or Appointed Before.
