once to Die, I have therefore in a sound Memory & good  
Understanding made this my last will & Testament in  
the Sixty Fifth Year of my age at the following Manner

Firstly I Command my soul into the hand of my God  
& Redeemer Jesus Christ and my Body into the Earth  
To be Buried into the same in a Christian manner

Secondly it is my will that my son Frederick shall have  
my Plantation I now live on Containing one Hundred  
& Twenty Eight Acres more or less Situate Lying  
so being on Mill Creek, Adjoining to the Land of  
Michael Power & to the Land of John Shore Deceased  
Together with Good Right & Deed for the same

Thirdly it is my will that my Son Frederick shall have  
Two horses, two Cows, two Sheep, & all the Hogs  
Belonging to me, one Loom & all the Tacklings Belong-  
ing to the same, one Saddle & one half Waggon & all  
the Horse Tack thereunto Belonging & all the Household  
Goods whatsoever

Fourthly it is my will that my wife Cve Fost  
after my Disease Shall have liberty to live  
my place with my son Frederick Fisher a  
son shall be Obliged to Maintain her all the

Ninthly it is my will if in Case it Should happen that  
my wife Eve. Fishers Could not Peaceably & Quietly  
Live with my Son Frederick then the said Frederick  
Fishers Shall be Obliged to Give Unto my wife Eve.  
Frederick Yearly & Every Year as Long as he remaines  
Twelve Bushells of Wheat one hundred Weight of  
Buttles Fifty Pounds of Beef £.50. Buttles & all other  
Necessaries as aforesaid Whosoever

Tenthly I give unto my wife Eve. Fishers one Brown  
mare to her own Property

Eleventhly it is my will that my son Frederick  
Fishers Shall pay unto my son Adam Fishers also  
unto my Daughter Eve Fishers, the sum of a Twenty  
Pounds Due to Each of them as soon as they have  
their age according to law & if it should happen that  
my son Frederick Fishers should die without Brodeley  
Heirs then it is further my will that after his Decease  
My son Adam Fishers shall have his place

Twelfthly it is my will that if it shoud happen that  
my son Adam Fishers shoud become the Owner  
of the Place aforesaid & at the manner before mentioned  
then the aforesaid Adam Fishers shall be bound &  
Obliged to Performe & Fulfill all the Promises and

by the Grace of God King of Great Britain &c

We the subscribers Commissioners Appointed by Act of  
Assembly for running the Boundary lines between the said County of Surry  
& the Counties of Rowan and Guilford in Conformity to the said Act have run  
the same Accordingly and are as follows Vizt —

Beginning at a first Oak Standing in a hollow at a small Distance from  
Meddersby Fork of Haw River and on the NW side being the corner of Rowan County  
and Surry County Running from thence N<sup>E</sup> 3 Miles to the <sup>Brady</sup> fork of Haw  
River thence 4 Miles to the Waters Belvoir Creek, Thence thence crossing said  
Creek to William Hammocks 7 Miles then crossing the said Creek again at 10 Miles  
at a River Miles crossing it again at a very high hill, at 40 pole crossing said  
Creek at a fall & a fish Trap at 13 miles and three quarters crossed s<sup>d</sup> Creek again  
above John Southerlands & then crossed Dan River at the upper end of Lado Island  
through the lower end of Lado Rd clearing thence crossing Dan River Turned  
Neals Bent at a white Oak on the North bank then across the Dan upper  
Road where a branch crosses said Road about 4 Miles from Farmhouse Ford on  
Dan River thence by William Crumpe on Beaver Island Creek crossing the
