I Hugh Cleaton Denizen of the County of Samp^t & State of North Carolina,
being at they time of ~~sick~~ mind but in low state of bodily
health, do make they my last will & testament.

And first I resign my soul to my creator in hope of
redemption thro the blood of Christ my Redeemer & my body
to be decently buried. And as for my worldly estate
I dispose of it in the following manner first, To my grand Son
John Cleaton I give and bequeath two hundred acres of
land on the water^y of Flathole Creek surveyed joining
Philip Wilson, And to my grandson Hugh Clemon I give
and bequeath two hundred acres of land, on the water^y of Snow
Creek called the roundabout. I give (and bequeath to my
Son in law Isaac Clemons) my negro man Isaac to balance
what I have already given to my Son in law Stephen Cleaton
and his Son Stephen; And all the residue of my estate real
and personal after my burial expences I give & bequeath
To my two daughters Mary Cleaton & Alice Clemon
equally to be divided between them.

And I hereby constitute and appoint to two Sons
Stephen Cleaton & Isaac Clemons my executors to
execute this my will. And I do hereby make null &
void all other wills by me heretofore made, confirming
this to be my last will & Testament.
