

9th In the name of God amen, this day of May 1787 legally seen
I Hugh Denton of the County of Surry & State of North Carolina,
being at this time of sound mind but in low state of bodily
health; do make this my last will & Testament. —

And first I resign my Soul to my Creator in hopes of
redemption thro the blood of Christ my Redeemer & my body
to be decently buried. — And as for my worldly estate
I dispose of it in the following manner to wit, To my grand Son
John Cleaton I give and bequeath two hundred acres of
land on the waters of Flatshole Creek surveyed joining
Phillip Wilson; And to my grandson Hugh Glenong I give
and bequeath two hundred acres of land, on the waters of Snow
Creek called the roundabout. I give and bequeath to my
Son in law Isaac Glenong my negro man Isaac to ballance
what I have already gave to my Son in law Stephen Cleaton
and his Son Stephen; And all the residue of my estate real
and personal after my burial expences I give & bequeath
to my two daughters Mary Cleaton & Ann Glenong
equally to be divided between them. —

And I hereby constitute and appoint to two Sons
Stephen Cleaton & Isaac Glenong my executors to
execute this my will. And I do hereby make null &
void all other wills by me heretofore made, confirming
this to be my last will & Testament. —

he saw John Duang & John Linn sign the same as witnesses.

the estate of Stephen Clayton who died on the 27th of June 1784
which property is now in the hands of Stephen Clayton junr
as follows, to wit, His clothing & household furniture to £ 22. 5. 8
