

In the Name of God, Amen, I James Glenn of Surry County and Province of North Carolina being very sick and weak Body but of perfect mind and Memory thanks be to God for it, calling to mind the Mortality of my Body do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament, in manner following I Recommend my Soul into the hand of Almighty God, that gave it and my Body I recommend to the Earth, to be Buried in decent Christian Burial, at the Discretion of my Executors and as touching such worldly Estate, where with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form, First I give and bequeath to Patience Gen, my Dearly beloved, wife Negro wench Jean her Life time and the use of my Negroes, till my youngest Child is fourteen years old, Namely Daniel, Delce and Morning and Jude also six Cows and Calves of her own Chooing and my Sorrel Horse saddle and Bridle also I give her all the House hold Goods during her Widowhood and at my wife Dece, for it all to be Divided Equally Between my six Daughters, Namely, Lucy Susanna Elizabeth Sarah Nancy and Martha, I give and bequeath to my beloved son Tompson my tract of Land in Rowleson and one hundred pounds, pro, I also give him Dick Mare Colt and a saddle and Bridle and my

my two plantations Brucepeez and Philips and all the w^{ts}
of my Stock and what Ready Money I have by me all my
Judicial Debts to paid all Debts due me, and my Debts to be
Equally Decided between between my six Daughters
Lucy Susanna Elizabeth Sarah Nancy Marthen et al
my Children have reasonable schooling at the Discretion
of my Executors Likewise constitute make and Ordain
my wife Patience and Joseph Barnett. Executors of this
my last will and testament and do hereby utterly dis-
allow and revoke all former Testament Wills Legacies &
Executors ratifying and confirming this and no other
to be my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty eight
Day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and seventy seven
