her Life time and the rest of my Negroes to my  
youngest Child is fourteen years old Namely Daniel  
Delce and Morning and Jude Also Six Cows and  
Calves of her one Churning and my Sorrel Horse  
Saddell and Bridle Also I give her all the House  
Hold Goods During her Widowhood and at my wife  
Dece's for it all to be Divided Equally Between my  
six Daughters Namely, Lucy Susanna Elizabeth  
Sarah Nancy and Martha, I give and bequeath  
to my beloved Son Tompson my tract of Land In or  
Culson and one hundred pounds pro, I also give him  
Dick Mare Colt and a saddle and Bridle and my

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my two plantations Bruceps and Philips and all the value  
of my Stock and what Ready Money I have by me all my  
Judicial Debts to paid all Debts due me, and my Debts to be  
Equally Decided between my six Daughters  
Lucy Susanna Elizabeth Sarah Nancy Marthen all  
my Children have reasonable schooling at the Discretion  
of my Executors Likewise constitute make and Ordain  
my wife Patience and Joseph Barnett. Executors of this  
my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly dis-  
-allow and revoke all former Testament Wills Legacies &  
Executors ratifying and confirming this and no other  
to be my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twenty eight  
Day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven  
hundred and seventy seven
