Item I give and bequeath to my son William Halcome one  
Cow and Calf Item I give and bequeath to my son Lawrence  
Halcome one Cow and Calf Item I give to my son George  
Halcome all the rest of my Estate, Both Real and personal not  
herefore mentioned and I do appoint my wife Elizabeth  
and my son George Halcome Executors of this my last will  
and testament I do Revoke Personal and make void all  
former Wills by me heretofore made or spoken of in —
