last will and testament, viz, and first of all I give my soul to God,
who gave it me, and my Body to the Earth to be decently Buried
after the Directions of my Executors hereafter mentioned my will
and Desire is that all my Worldly Debt be first paid & discharge^d
and for the rest and Residue of what worldly Goods it hath
pleased, Almighty God to be shew upon me I give and bequeath
as followeth, I Item I give and bequeath unto my Dear wife
Elizabeth my Estate both real and personal during her life and
after her decease to be divided amongst my Children as follows
I Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Halcome ten shillings
proclamation Money, I Item I give and bequeath to my son John
Halcome ten shillings proclamation Money, I Item and bequeath
to my son James Halcome ten shillings proclamation Money
I Item I give and bequeath to my son William Halcome one
cow and calf I Item I give and bequeath to my son Lawrence
Halcome one cow and calf I Item I give to my son George
Halcome all the rest of my Estate, both Real and personal not
hitherto mentioned and I do appoint my wife Elizabeth
and my son George Halcome Executors of this my last will
and testament I do Revoke Censual and make void all
former wills by me heretofore made or Spoken of In
Witness whereof I set my hand and seal this the fifth
Day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and twenty nine John Halcome (Seal)

Item I bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Charles
all my Estate of every kind real and personal during
her natural life or widowhood but in Case my
wife should marry or die then I will that my Estate
Equally divided amongst my nine Children viz.
