In the name of God amen, I Margaret Barbara Nausen am weak in body but sound in my mind; I therefore make my last Will & Testament, Leaving unto Philip Snyder my land being one hundred acres, with the buildings, for ready money in hand money; but if he should not accept of it, it may be sold to another. Of this money I leave five pounds for the schoolhouse at Friedland. To Johannes Row in Pennsbuch in New England I leave eight pounds. To Jeromech Israel one cow. To Michael Hogler one cow. To Philip Snyder one cow also. Michael Hogler & Philip Green I appoint as my Executors; Michael Hogler to take care of my house; Out of my outstanding debts namely three pounds owing by Friedrich Miller in hand money and three pounds in hand money owing by Mordican Mendenhall, my burial expences are to be paid; What will be over is to go to the society for the propagation
