of December in the Year of our Lord 1771 J. Nicholas Evans Esq; of New
County in North Carolina being ready sick of Body but of perfect
Mind and Memory Thanks be given to god Therefor calling on
to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it was
appointed for all men hence to die, Do make and Ordain this my
Last will & Testament That is to say
of Omnipotency and first of all I give & Recommend my soul into the
hands of god that gave it and for my Body I recommend it to
the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and decent Manner
At the Devotion of my Ecclesian Nothing Doubting but at the
General Resurrection, I shall Receive the same again by the mighty
Power of god And as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith
it hath pleased god to bless me within this life I give and dispose
of the same in the following Manner and form Imprimis
It is my will and I do Order that in the first place all my just Debts
be paid and funeral Charges satisfied Item I gave and Requested
to Ease my beloved wife all my stock of Creatures and household
Goods and Movable Item, I give to my well beloved Son Thomas
For my Right and Title of the plantation on where I now live the only
I under and require him to pay yearly for every year the sum of five
pounds his mother ^{and} his Beloved wife whom I constituted
Attache and Ordaine While she liveth With Moses Martin my friend
My only And sole Executor of this my last will & Testament
Of so order every other of my Children to be paid One shilling each
if they Com for it And I do Disallow & Banish and revoke every
Other former Will Legacy and Execution by me in any way before
this time named Will Despatched and confirmed this my last
will and Testament on the 18th day of December I have hereunto set
My hand & seal the day & year above written
