Pounds, one Waggon and Still Likewise one third
part of my personal Estate, Except my Negro's and
House hold furniture, Them, I give to my Daughter Mary
McCarrol two Negro's, viz, Bet and Middy Likewise one
half of my House hold furniture and one third part
of my stock of Horses Cattle Sheep Hogs and Money
Them I send to my beloved wife Elizabeth^{Mc}Carrol two
Negro's, viz, Nan and Jacob Likewise one half of my House
hold furniture one third part of all my stock of Horses Cattle
Hogs and Sheep one half of the working tools of the, car and

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The Plantation and one third part of my Money during
during her natural life, all which after her death to
descend to my son John M. Carrol Lastly I will that if
any of the above legacies should die without issue
I sue that then their part return to be Equally Divided
among the survivors of them signed with my hand
sealed with my seal published & declared to be my last
will and Testament this twenty six day of Oct^r 1779
