make and Ordain this my last will and Testament
In manner and form following that is to say I premise
Item I will that all my Debts and funeral charges be paid
and Discharged by my wife Elizabeth Carroll Item
I give to my Son Thomas H. Carroll two Thousand
Pounds, one Waggon and Still likewise one third
part of my personal Estate, Except my Negro's and
House hold furniture, Item, I give to my Daughter Mary
H. Carroll two Negro's, Viz, Pet and Lilly & the wife one
half of my Household furniture and one third part
of my Stock of Horses Cattle Sheep Hogs and Money
Item I leave to my beloved wife Elizabeth ^{me} Carroll two
Negro's, Viz Nan and Uncle likewise one half of my house
hold furniture one third part of all my Stock of Horses with
Hogs and Sheep one half of the working tools of the, carver

138 The Plantation and one third parts of my Money during
during her natural life, all which after her death to
descend to my son John M. Carroll & asly I will that if
any of the above legatis should die without lawfull
Issue that then their part return to be Equally Divided
among the survivors of them signed with my hand
sealed with my Seal published & declared to be my last
will and Testament this twenty six day of Decr. 1779
