The twentieth day of February In the year of our
Lord One Thousand seven hundred & ninety I Patrick
Logan of ye County of Surry & State of North Carolina
farmer being sick & weak of body but of perfect mind &
memory thanks be given to God Therefore calling unto
mind ye mortality of my body and knowing ^{that} it is appointed
for all men once to die do make & ordain this my Last
will & Testament and as touching such worldly Estate
as providence has blessed me with in this life I give
devise and dispose of ye same in the following manner.

First of all that my doory & furniture coming in the path.
Item I Give & bequeath to my beloved son George Logan Three
Hundred & Seventy acres of Land beginning at John Logans
corner Stake on ye ~~low~~ east line of ye old tract runng east
forty two chains thence South eighty nine chains thence
west twenty four chains thence North twenty eight chains
to a post Oak thence west sixteen chains to the Creek then
up ye same to John Logans line & so along his line North-
ward to ye beginning with all ye appertemances thereunto
belonging by him freely to be ~~possessed~~ & enjoyed except
one hundred acres of Land laid off convenient & including my
now dwelling house & orchard with handy fire wood & rail
fence I reserve for my wifes support & maintainance her
life time or widowhood: likewise It is my Will that a
further exception be made that is that ye east & west line
that runng between this old part of ye plantation & my son Hugh
Logans ^{plantation} should be continued till it strikes ^{ye} old line.

Item I Give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Logan
ye above excepted land & I wilidge aforesaid together with her own
bed & furniture also all ye other household furniture excepting
one bed & furniture for my daughter Bonnie Logan & two cows
& calves & after my sons Hugh, John, and George Logan; and my

of my cattle shall be my wife's during her life time or
widowhood also her choice of a horse creature bridle & saddle and
one negro woman Lues and a negro girl named Gilley and at
ye end of my Wife Mary Logans widowhood or her life time
and then my son George Logan is to enjoy ye land that was
excepted for my Wife's Maintenance and all ye aforesaid
plantation except what was excepted ye southside of ye
aforesaid continued line to my son Hugh and then all ye
property that I left in my wife's care to be equally divided
amongst all my children Male & Female as well as if
made except what negroes is in my Wife's care to be equally
divided between my four sons (to wit) John, Hugh, James,
and George Logan.

Item I Give & bequeath to my beloved son John Logan three
hundred acres of land on both sides of Joseph Creek begin-
ning at a post oak ye North West corner of my old deeded
land run thence East crossing said Creek thirty-three
chains to a stake thence South fifteen chains to a pine thence
South twenty-five degrees West ^{twenty} two and a half chains cross
ye said Creek to a stake and stump thence West eighty-three
chains and sixty-five links to a post oak thence North

thirty-six chains to a pine tree thence East to ye beginning with
his equal share of ye aforesaid division.

Item, I give and bequeath to my beloved son ~~James Logan~~ an
two hundred and eighty acres of land on ye West side of
Joseph Creek beginning at a post Oak John Logans corner runs
South thirty chains to a post oak thence East ninety two and
a half chains to a spanish oak on ye bank of said creek
thence up ye same as it meanders to a birch on John Logans
line thence South twenty-five degrees West along ye same
nine chains to his corner thence West to ye beginning with
his equal share of ye aforesaid division.

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved son Hugh Logan two
hundred & fourteen acres of land with what land is on ye
South side of ye aforesaid continued line taken of my son
George's land as aforesaid beginning at a post oak James
Logans corner runs South sixteen & a half chains to a
thence East sixty chains & sixty-five links
to a white oak thence South six & a half chains thence East
fifty chains thence North twenty-eight chains to a post oak
thence West sixteen chains a sycamore tree on ye bank of
Joseph Creek thence down the same five chains to a span-
ish oak thence West to ye beginning with his equal share

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth
Rush one negro girl named Yerrece aged about fifteen
years of age & after her death to the lawfull heirs of her
body with her equal share of ye aforesaid division.

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary
Phillips one negro girl named Peg about thirteen years
& after her death to ye lawfull heirs of her body with her
equal share of ye aforesaid division.

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Honour
Logan one negro girl named Glery aged about twelve
years and after her death to ye lawfull heirs of her body
with her equal share of ye aforesaid division.

Item I give & bequeath to my Granddaughter Elizabeth
Vandeford ye sum of fifteen pounds & to my Granddaugh-
ter Mary Logan ye sum of ten pounds to be paid by my
Executors before any division is made among my children.

Likewise I constitute make & ordain my sons John & James
Logan my only & sole Executors of this my Last
Will & Testament & do hereby utterly, disallow, revoke, &
disannul all & every other former Testaments, Wills, &
Last Wishes, Requests, & Executors; by me in any wise before this

time nominated Willed & Bequeathed ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my Last Will & Testament
In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand & seal
ye day & year above written.
