two hundred acres of land lying on the North side of
my land I now live on, joining Samuel Wainwright line,
Joshua Dillery and John Bradleys lines. Also my will
and desire is to give and bequeath to my son John
Bradley three hundred acres of land joining of Leonard
Bradleys land on the South side, and part of the good tract
I now live on; also my will and desire is to give to my son
George Bradley all the remaining part of my land,
containing four hundred and seventy eight acres including
my land and plantation on the North side of Dan River.
Also my will and desire is to leave to my beloved wife
all the residue or remainder part of my estate, during
her natural life or widowhood and after her decease
for to be equally divided amongst my surviving
children, and whatsoever part of my estate shall fall

to my daughter Moley Nelson, my devise is, after her decease,
to be equally divided amongst their children. Also I appoint
my son John Bradley & George Bradley, my executors to this
