Resurrection I shall receive same again by the
mighty power of God and as touching such worldly
Estate where with it hath pleased God to bless me in this
Life I give Devise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and first I give and bequeath to Mary my dearely
beloved wife I leave all my moveable property I do give
to my Daughter Elizabeth Clayton or Negro boy named
James I do give to my Daughter Nancy Clayton my
Plantation and land that I now possesse and enjoy &
the first mare colt that the mare has and her increase to
be. Mary my wife This to be my last Will

and Testament in witness whereof I have set my hand &
Seal this 9th day of October in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and eighty One signed sealed

sum of five hundred pounds Specie of said State to be paid
to said Alexander Martin Esq^r and his successors
to which payment we shall truly to be made our Bonds
our Silver or Hairs Executors and Administrators jointly &
severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals
and dated this 15th day of May, 1782.

The Condition of the above Obligation is such that
whoever the above Bound Richard Goode shall faithfully
execute and discharge his Duty as Ranger and
according to Law then this Obligation to be Void
otherwise to Remain in full force & Virtue
