

On the Twentieth day of the month of January in the year of our Lord Christ, one thousand seven hundred and eighty two, I Phillip Waggoner of the County of Surry and State of North Carolina being weak in Body but of perfect memory thank God, and calling to mind that all men must die do therefore ordain this my Last will and Testament first recommending my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it me and my Body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors here after named and as to my worldly Estate I Dispose of it in the following manner, Inprimis I lend to my beloved wife Elizabeth Waggoner the Land and plantation whereon I live, together with all my stock of every kind and House hold furniture during her Widowhood or until my son Adam arrives to the Age of twenty one years at which time it is my will and desire that the whole Estate Except what is here after bequeathed be sold to the Highest Bidders Reserving to my wife the Benefit of the House & the Childs part of the Land during her Widowhood, the money arising from said sale be Equally divided between my beloved wife and my following Children Viz, Elizabeth Catharine Christian Pamel Adam Susanna and Margaret to them and their Heirs forever Item I give & bequeath to my son Adam a Black Horse Colt with a Saddle and Bridle to take possession immediately after my Decease to him and his Heirs forever, Item I give and bequeath to my son in Law Henry Stultz a certain bay mare and a Cow now in his possession to him and his Heirs forever Item it is my Desire that each and every one of my Children have a Cow and Horse Comator out of my Estate as they marry,

each and every one of my Children have a share and a
Share hereafter out of my Estate as they marry Nearly
the Value of those given to Henry Shultz to them and
their Heirs forever, Lastly I do appoint my beloved
wife Elizabeth Waggoner Executrix and ^{Henry} Shultz & my
son Adam Waggoner Executors to this my last will
and Testament in Testimony whereof I have hereunto
