I give and bequeath to my son in law John Childress
the Other half of my Stock of Horses Item my Will &
Desire is that my part of my Brothers John Armstrong
Estate be Equally Divided Between John Childress William
Armstrong Dillon Blevins and Humpord Smith
Item I give and bequeath to my son in law James
Spencer five Shillings, my Will and Desires is that if
my son William Armstrong Should die before he
has a living Heir that his part above mentioned should
be Equally Divided Between John Childress Dillon Blevins
and Humpord Smith Item I do lastly constitute Nomine
nato and appoint John Childress and William Armstrong
Executors of this my Last Will and Testament. In witness

Executors of this my Last Will and Testament In witness
