it is appointed for man to die, do make this my last Will and  
testament in manner and form following, to say,

In presence I resign my soul to God who gave it thro' the  
mercy of Jesus Christ my Saviour, and my body to the earth  
to be buried in a decent manner, at the discretion of my executors.

Item, I give unto my son Dan Hill the land and plantation  
on which I now live. Item, I give unto my son Jose Hill an  
improvement or claim of land adjoining the above mentioned plantation  
Item, I give unto my three youngest sons James Hill Joshua &  
Joel Hill each five pounds to be applied in schooling them  
at the discretion of my son Dan Hill.

I am & Will seal all my other estate of every kind be equally divided  
among my three children (viz) William Hill, Elijah Hill, Pharay  
Sister Hill, Robert Hill, W.C. Hill, Dan Hill, Jesse Hill, young  
Hill, Joshua Hill, Joel Hill or the surviving of them.

Lastly I do constitute and appoint my sons William, Robert &  
Dan Hill Executors to my last will & testament. Signed  
with my hand, sealed with my seal and dated this day of

one thousand seven hundred and seventy four.
