Body I Recommend to the Earth, to be Buried in decent
Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors
and as touching such Worldly Estate where with it
hath pleased God to bless me in this Life I give devise
and Dispose of the same in the following manner
and form, First I give and bequeath to Patience
Gen^l my Dearly beloved wife Negro woman Jean
her Life time and the rest of my Negroes, to my
youngest Child is fourteen years old Namely Daniel
Dill and Morning and Jude also Six Cows and
Calves of her one Churning and my Sorrel Horse
six dolls and Bridle also I give her all the House
Hold Goods Curing her Widow hood and at my wife
Dece^d, for it all to be Divided Equally Between my
six Daughters Namely, Lucy Susanna Elizabeth
Sarah Nancy and Martha, I give and bequeath
to my beloved son Tompson my tract of Land Inow
Lacan and one hundred four acres, I also give him
