Province which they have Recurred -  
Item I give and Bequeath to my Son John Ward the sum  
of £ 27, 10 of such like money as above & Two Cows &  
Calves for him the said John to receive at the age of 21  
years & all the Residue of my Estate I have to my Beloved  
wife Mary During her Natural Life or Widouchood and  
after to be Equally Divided amongst all my Children No  
less than Ann Elizabeth, Mary, Sarah, William, Henry, Robert  
& John.
