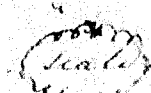
John Hubbert one of the subscribing Witnesses to the

In the Name of God Amen, I William Smith
of the County of Swery and State no. Carolina being in
perfect mind and Memory thanke be given unto God and
knowing it is appointed for all men once to die to make and
order this my Last Will and Testament first it is desired that
my Buriall be at the Discretion of my Executors and as touching
such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God to bless me
in this life I give devise and Dispose of the same in the
following Manner, and form, First I lend to Elizabeth my wife
all that parcel of Land which I now possess out of which is to be
raised all my young Children after which if any Overplus
should arise that part is to be for my son Samuel, which Land
with the Appurtenances sh^e is to possess only during her life
or Widowhood, also after the Death or Marriage of my wife
the Land which I possess I give and bequeath unto my
son Samuel, out of which he is to pay unto my son Thomas.

186 Thomas fifty pounds in Spain, or in currency at the
depreciation which money he is to receive as soon as my son
Samuel gets possession of the above mentioned land. Also
I give all that part of my Estate, that part of which now lies
in the hands of my Mother Equally to be Divided between
my two sons William and John. Also I give and bequeath
unto my six Daughters, Mary Pittymann Susanah Martha
Nancy and Sally, every other part of my Estate which is Equally
Divided at the Death or Marriage of my wife this my last
will and Testament do constitute and appoint William
East and Thomas East, my Executors in witness where of
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 9th day of
November 1780. At the word lend in the eighth line and the
words in currency at the depreciation in the twentieth line
are interlined before assigned,
