Burton Laney. Last will and Testament
In the name of God Amen.

I, Burton Laney
of the county of Union and State of North Carolina.
Being of sound mind and memory and considering
the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do there-
fore make ordain, publish and declare this to be my
Last Will and Testament: That is to say, First: after
all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the
residue of my Estate real and personal, I give bequeath
and dispose of as follows: To Wit: To my beloved Wife, the
Land and appertinances situated thereon, it being part
of the tract known as the Russel Rogers tract on which
I now reside Including Two Hundred and fifty nine
(259) Acres, during her life and at her death to the

Heirs of her body: To my Daughter Margaret A. Laney, One Hundred (100) Acres of Land being included in a state grant of Fifty seven (57) Acres and in another state grant of Twenty two (22) Acres as will appear by reference to my papers, and also twenty one acres off of the Rogers tract where it joins the 57 acre tract grant, so as to make 100 Acres of Land.

To my Daughter Salitha Huntley during her life and at her death to the heirs of her Body. One Hundred (100) Acres of Land it being described in state grant No. 4521, also among my papers.

To my Daughter Larica Brown during her life, and at her death to the heirs of her body. One Hundred ^{thirteen} (107) Acres of Land a part of the Rogers tract known as the mountain Spring tract.

To my son David W. Laney a tract of One Hundred and fifty (150) Acres being part of the Rogers tract lying on the mountain Spring, or Cheraw Road and particularly described in a plat among my papers, dated October 26th 1857 and marked "A" during his life and at his death, to the heirs of his Body.

To the three children of my deceased son Roley A. Laney, viz Burton H. Laney Martha E. Laney and Larica E. Laney, One Hundred Acres of Land in joint tenancy, it being a part of the Aaron Rogers tract lying on the east side of Buck Branch and containing

To my son Archy A. Laney One Hundred
and thirty (130) Acres of land, It being the south and east
part of the tract known as the Philmore tract and lying on both
sides of the Cherraw Road.

To my Daughter Arena A. Laney ^{Rogers} during her
life and at her death to the heirs of her body, One Hundred
Acres of land being part of the Philmore tract and joining the
above described tract of my son Archy A. Laney.
