I will and Bequeath to my son Jerome Rice the Star quilt I also divide Equalely other quilts I will Emer Rice the Clock & I also will Emer Rice my Trunk & Desk I will Emer Rice one white Counterpin I will Jerome Rice my Little Table I also will and bequeath to my son Jerome Rice my Cradle & the I also will and deirs to my Daughter Emer Rice, my Cheers & Remainder of House hold kitchen furniture it is my will that my mule & farming tools be sold at auction to highest Bider and my Dets Paid and if any thing Left to Be divided Equalely Between Emer & Jerome Rice I also will and Bequeath to my Daughter Emer Rice two thirds of my Interest in my Fathers Estate. also my Son Jerome Rice the Remainder I appoint my Friend Gary Medlin my Executor of this will. in witness whereof I Clarinda Rice have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 3 Feb 1890
