

The last Will & Testament of Elizabeth F. Glenn
In the name of God Amen.

I, Elizabeth F. Glenn of the County of Union
and State of North Carolina being of sound
and disposing mind and memory,
but considering the uncertainty of life
and the certainty of death, and desiring
to make a just and judicious disposal
of the property which God has been pleased
to bless me with while I yet retain
a disposing mind and memory, do
make this my last will and testament
in manner and form following viz:

That my executor hereinafter named
shall provide for my body a decent
burial suitable to the wishes of my relations
and friends and pay all funeral expenses
together with my just debts however
and whomever owing out of the money
that may first come to his hands as
a part or parcel of my estate.

Item I do will and bequeath unto the bodily
heirs of my son James R. Glenn, now
deceased Five Dollars & no more.

to make a just and judicious disposal
of the property which God has been pleased
to bless me with while I yet retain
a disposing mind and memory, do
make this my last will and testament
in manner and form following viz:
That my executor herein after named
shall provide for my body a decent
burial suitable to the wishes of my relations
and friends and pay all funeral expenses
together with my just debts howsoever
and whomever owing out of the money
that may first come to his hands as
a part or parcel of my estate.

Item 1st I will and bequeath unto the bodily
heirs of my Son James R Glenn now
deceased Five Dollars & no more.

Item 2^d I will and bequeath to the bodily
heirs of my Son George L Glenn now
decd Five Dollars and no more.

 Item 3^d It will and bequeath to the Bodily heirs
 of my Son John B Glenn now deceased Five
 Dollars and no more.

Item 4th It will and bequeath unto my daughter
 Jane B Richardson intermarried with John
 Richardson One Hundred Dollars and no
 more.

Item 5th It will and bequeath unto my two daughters
 Mary A Glenn and Sarah A Glenn all the
 residue of my estate both real and perso-
 nal after the above legacies are paid,
 consisting of the Plantation on which
 I now live, and all my stock of every
 kind and all personal property of which
 I may be seized and possessed, subject
 however to the provisions of the next
 and Sixth Item of this my last will
 and Testament.

Item 6th My will and desire is that my exe-
 cutor as soon after my death as he may
 think best do sell at public sale all such
 personal property as my two daughters
 Mary A and Sarah A Glenn have and

Item 6th My will and desire is that my executor as soon after my death as he may think best do sell at public Sale all such personal property as my two daughters Mary & Sarah of Glenm may not want to keep, and after paying all just demands against my estate and the legacies allowed in this my last will and testament to pay any surplus of money, that may be in his hands to the said Mary & Sarah of Glenm.

And lastly, I do hereby appoint my trusty friend and Son in Law John Richardson to execute this my last Will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and making void all others wills and Testaments by me theretofore made.
