

Last Will and Testament of George McManus

The following is the Ununcapitive Will of  
 George McManus as made by him during  
 his last sickness, which was on Saturday  
 last the 22<sup>d</sup> day of January AD 1881  
 the day upon which he died, at the re-  
 sidence of Nathaniel J. McManus in Union  
 County the place at which the Testator  
 had previously resided for upward of  
 three months, which said Will was  
 witnessed by us at the request of  
 the Testator, who especially required  
 us to bear witness thereto: The  
 Testator, after stating to us that he  
 was going to make his Will & that  
 he desired us to bear witness thereto  
 said:

I want my Doctor Bill, and my store  
 account paid out of my property, I  
 want Nathaniel J. McManus & Billy  
 Garland paid for taking care of  
 me, The balance of my property  
 I want to go to my child by marriage

Carland paid for taking care of  
me, The balance) of my property  
I want to go to my Child by Matice  
Byram, I want old Missus Mrs Mary  
McNamee to execute my will.  
The above Will is this day reduced  
to writing by us, in accordance  
as we are advised the law requires.

The undersigned paper writing purporting  
to be the unexecuted will of George

after having caused notice to  
be issued and served upon Jane

Last Will and Testament of George McMunnus  
 Mr. McMunnus and George McMunnus, the  
 wife and child of George McMunnus (deceased)  
 do find and certify to the following facts  
 which are sworn to and proven by  
 Nathaniel McMunnus and Riley Garland  
 That George McMunnus for more than  
 three months immediately preceding his  
 death had resided at the residence of Mr.  
 Nathaniel McMunnus, that the said George  
 McMunnus deceased, in his last sickness at  
 his place of residence, on the day of  
 his death to wit, on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January  
 1881 told the said Nathaniel McMunnus and  
 Riley Garland, that he was going to die, and  
 called upon them specially to bear witness  
 to his Will, which he was then about to make  
 and thereupon he declared in their presence  
 his will to be as follows. "I want my  
 Doctor Bill and my attorney account paid out  
 of my property, I want Nathaniel McM  
 unnus and Riley Garland paid for taking  
 care of me. The balance of my property  
 I want to go to my child by Matilda Brown"

(I was going to add, am  
called upon them specially to bear witness  
to his Will, which he was then about to make  
but whereupon he declared in their presence  
his will to be as follows, "I want my  
Doctor Bill and my Board Account paid out  
of my property, I want Nathaniel J MC  
Manus and Riley Garland paid for taking  
care of me. The balance of my property  
I want to go to my child by Matice Bryan  
I want old Mrs Mary McManus to  
execute my will.

Now therefore, I James C Hughey Judge  
of Probate for the County of Union in  
the State of North Carolina, do declare and  
adjudge that the said paper witness  
contains the last Will and Testament of  
George McManus deceased and that the same  
has been properly proved before me according  
to law. Let the said Will with this  
certificate be recorded.
