Will & testament

In the name of God: Amen.

I, Henry J. Long, of the County of Union and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and good memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do this the 22nd day of June 1875, declare this Instrument of writing to be my last Will and Testament; in manner and form as follows.

Item 1st. I will that all my just debts is paid out of my effects, out of my Personal Property, and all the remainder of my Personal property to go to the use of my Wife and Children only.

Article the 2nd. I will and give to my beloved Wife Hester C. Long my Tract of Land we now live on as long as long as she lives, or till she marries again; if so but if she marries again or departs this life then the Land to be equally divided between my bodily Heirs.

Article the 3rd. I will and give unto my bodily Heirs the tract of Land known as the queen tract to be equally divided between them.

Article the 4th. I nominate and appoint A. J. Austin and W. C. Long my lawful Executors to my last Will and Testament.
