Item I give and devise to my said wife Mary, all my Stock of Horses Cattle and Dogs with with all my Household and Kitchen furniture with all my farming implements, my Waggon Buggys, and Hammers all the provisions, Corn Wheat Bacon and all the forage of every sort that may

be on hand at my death.

Item, I give and devise to my said wife Mary  
two tracts pieces or lots of Land in the County of Union  
State of North Carolina in the Corporate limits of the  
Town of Monroe, One piece land as follows viz:

Beginning at a Stone Corner of No 2, and runs with  
a Line of Cedars, Street N. 87 E 2= 18 ch to 2 Stones  
on the west Side of a Branch thence down Said Branch  
its various Courses 92 feet to a Stone on the west Side  
of Branch R. V. Houston's Corner thence with his  
line to Stone Corner of No 2, thence with line of No 2,  
S 5 E 103 feet to the Beginning. The Other piece or Lot

I, Stev. I give and devise to my daughter, Mary P. Robinson,  
wife of Simeon A. Robinson, a certain piece or tract  
of land lying in Union County North Carolina on West  
Twelve mile Creek adjoining the lands of Mr. Simpson,  
Andy Shannon, Green Ray, and others. Containing One  
hundred and twenty two acres more or less known as  
part of the Old Ray place, to her, and to her, heirs forever;

I, Stev. I give and devise to my son Joel H. Dastay, a  
certain piece or parcel of land, composed of three small  
tracts lying in the County of Union North Carolina  
on Little Richardson Creek adjoining the lands of  
Bob Starnes Colrd, James Peacock Mrs. Margaret Bibb  
and Others (Known as the Aldridge Place.)  
Containing two hundred acres more or less to him and  
to his heirs forever.
