Polk & others sold & my negro boy Peter sold at public sale, also all my farming tools to my wife, household & kitchen furniture & to remain hers during her lifetime or widowhood & then she marries my executor to sell all the willed property & make an equal division with my heirs & Charles E. Schorn is my executor in transacting all of business, all my stock of geese to the widow & my blacksmith tools to be sold & the property that she dont want to be sold ^{and} all of wheat crop & oats at home to belong to wife this my last will & testament made and signed sealed & delivered in the presence of us September the 7th A.D. 1846
