Joseph R. Hudson of the County and State aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say:-

Item 1st That my executor (hereinafter named) shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts howsoever and to whomsoever owing out of the moneys that may first come into his or their hands as a part or parcel of my Estate.

Item 2nd I give and devise to my beloved wife Ann M. Hudson all of that tract of land where on I now live containing One Hundred and fifty acres more or less. Also to be
