Matthew Phifer's Will & Testament
I Matthew Phifer of the County of Union & State
of North Carolina being of sound mind & memory
but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence
do make & publish this my last will & testament in
manner & form following that is to say.

1st That my executor hereinafter named shall provide
for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations
& friends & pay all funeral expenses together with ^{my} just debts
howsoever to be whosoever owing out of the money that may
first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate

Item I give & devise unto my beloved wife Prisilla one
hundred & seventy eight acres of land the plantation ~~in particular~~
more lie to her & her use forever in satisfaction & in lieu of her
dower of one third of my lands & also the use of my mill & mill
plantation until my youngest son William H. Phifer comes to
the age of twenty one years. I also give & devise to my beloved
wife Prisilla two horse beasts her choice of my stock, all my
stock of cattle and sheep, all my stock logs that run about
the plantation, my road wagon & harness together with all my
farming tools, all my household & kitchen furniture, together
with my library & also my loom & harness & also my crops of

farming tools, all my household & kitchen furniture, together
with my library & also my farm & horses & also my crops of
cotton & I will that at or after my decease John Houston and
Amos Stevens be a committee to lay off & allot one year's provisions
for my wife & widow & family, I will that my wife & widow have
my negro man Seall to her & her use forever. My will & desire is
that if my grist mill be not finished at the time of my decease
it be finished at the expense of my estate, I also will that my wife
have my field cleared on father's plantation during the term of debts.

Item I give to my two sons William & Matthew D. Whigar my
mill & mill plantation when my youngest son comes of age to be then
valued to them & the proceeds be accounted for by them as a part of
their distributive share of my estate, or if my sons living at that
time would rather not have the plantation & mill valued to them as
a part of my estate, then & in that case where my wife's claim is
out on the mill plantation, it to be put up to public sale, on a
credit of twelve months & the proceeds be thrown into my estate
for division.

Item I will that my executor hereinafter named be authorized
& is hereby empowered to sell all my lands not otherwise disposed
of, both in this state & in the state of Georgia when they think it will
add most to the interest of my estate the proceeds of which to be account

for by them as a part of my estate.

Item my will & desire is that at the time of my decease all
the balance of my property not otherwise disposed of, be put up
at public sale on a credit of Twelve months, the proceeds together
with the cash that may come into the hands of my executor by
the sale of land or otherwise as a part of my estate be divided
among my heirs as follows viz my beloved wife Ursilla
Phifer, my daughter Elisabeth A. Phifer, & Margaret E. Phifer & Eliza
M. Phifer & Matthew J. Phifer & William H. Phifer & Sarah M. Phifer
& my daughter Rachel A. Phifer all to share & have alike.

And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my beloved wife
Ursilla Phifer my lawful executor to all intents & purposes
according to the true intent & meaning of the same & every part
& clause thereof hereby reciting & declaring utterly void all other
wills & testaments by me hitherto made. In witness whereof
the said Matthew Phifer do hereunto set my hand & seal this
tenth day of October A.D. One thousand eight hundred &
