Item 1<sup>st</sup> I will That all my just debts together with my burial expenses be paid by my Executresses hereinafter named out of any money belonging to my estate and sell property for that purpose if necessary.

+ Item 2<sup>d</sup> I will and bequeath all my property, real, personal and mixed to my two daughters Mary Jane Nesbit and Margaret Nesbit to be theirs forever.

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I do hereby constitute and appoint my two daughters above named Executresses to carry out the provisions of this my last Will and testament in its true sense, and I do hereby declare utterly void any other Will or Wills heretofore made by me.
